



Community center still open

GARFIELD HTS. There has been no change made at the Garfield Heights Community Center on Dressler Avenue as the school district is in the process of hiring an auctioneer to sell the building.

In the meantime, Garfield Schools Superintendent Dr. Jeanne Sternad and Dr. Alicia Lytle of the Word of Righteousness Family Life Center have agreed that Lytle's organization can remain in the building.

The Word of Righteousness which leases space in the former Roosevelt Elementary school is a faith-based, nonprofit organization serving Garfield Heights residents.

The group will be continuing its monthly food distribution to qualifying households on the first Saturday of each month at the center.

Lytle said the turnout for the food disbursement Feb. 7 was drastically reduced because many residents are under the impression that the building is closed. And therefore many were not there to receive the free food and household items provided.

"Unless otherwise notified, the public should rest assured that these services will continue," said Lytle.
